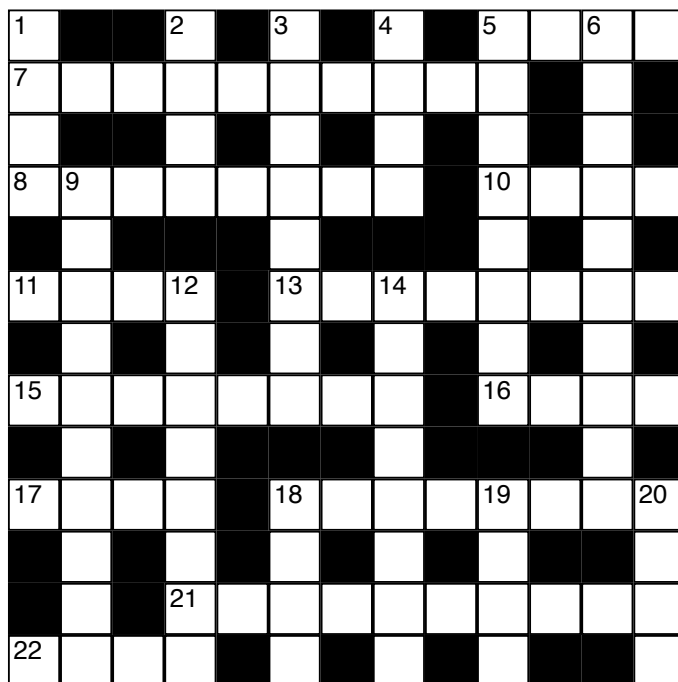

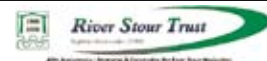

Sudbury to the Sea (S2C2010) on Saturday 11th & Sunday 12th September. This event began over thirty years ago and was then known as 'The Length of the River Cruise'. It was originally designed to ensure that the Navigation was used and to note any problems on the river. It was rebranded Sudbury to the Sea (S2C) in 2005 and has grown in popularity since then. Participants travel from all over the UK to navigate the 24½ miles (37km) of the River Stour, from Sudbury to the Cattawade Barrier, enjoying its many delights and seeing parts of the local countryside that are inaccessible by foot or road.
