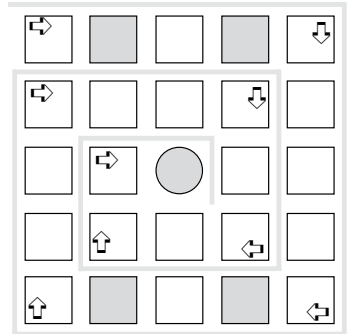

Concert in Lamarsh Church, Sunday 8th August. Holy Innocents Church, Lamarsh is a Grade 1 listed building, but is also a thriving place of worship where the congregation has grown since the arrival, a few years ago, of The Rev Margaret King. One of her greatest successes is to have brought in families with children, who assist with the services, as a result of which the congregation has grown considerably. However, in such a small village where there is a total population of under 200, it is incredibly difficult for the church to make ends meet, as the outgoings, excluding any maintenance, are around £8,000. The maintenance of the church has, for the last ten years, been paid for by The Friends of Lamarsh Church, who have raised nearly £60,000 in that time. Among the work undertaken has been the restoration of the bell, and the lime-washing of the exterior plasterwork. The church is therefore very fortunate to have been offered a Concert by a local resident who also happens to be a leading light behind the well known group Opus Anglicanum, who will also be performing at the Quay Theatre in Sudbury the night before. All the proceeds of the concert will go towards the annual cost of keeping the church open for worship. The concert in Lamarsh Church is themed around "words and music of love" and will start at noon and last an hour and will be followed by a buffet lunch with drinks at Sheepcote Farm, Great Henny. How Green is your wheelie bin?

Since the introduction of food waste recycling, residents have helped Braintree District Council divert over 13,000 tonnes of waste away from landfill this year, a rise of 30%.

Most residents are getting along fine by wrapping their food waste in newspaper or brown paper; however the collection crews have encountered problems where food waste has been wrapped in plastic degradable or biodegradable bags. These bags take far too long to break down so are not accepted by compost processors as they contaminate the compost.

When placing items into the green wheeled bin, residents are urged to only use compostable material to wrap their food waste, such as newspaper, brown paper and cardboard. If they want to use bags to line their kitchen caddy they must be 'compostable' bags which are made from corn starch or other vegetable matter and have the seedling logo.

Cllr Roger Walters Cabinet Member for Environment and Sustainability said "It is important that plastic bags of all varieties are kept out of the bin as they are oil based products added with a special additive which contaminate the compost. If our crews do spot a bin with anything that is not compostable, then they will not be able to collect it."

As a reminder of what to put in the bin

Put these items in

- Cooked and uncooked food
- Tea bags
- Coffee grounds
- Crushed egg shells
- Grass cuttings, prunings and leaves
- Small amounts of shredded paper and soft cardboard

Keep these items out

- Plastic bags of any kind even biodegradable ones
- Cat and dog excrement
- Disposable nappies
- Hard objects
